Paul Conway is an Associate Professor in the School of Information at the University of Michigan. Conway's research encompasses the digitization of cultural heritage resources, particularly photographic archives, the use of digitized resources by experts in a variety of humanities contexts, and the measurement of image and text quality in large-scale digitization programs. At the School of Information, Conway teaches graduate level courses on the administration of archives, preservation, and digital libraries. He also teaches an upper level undergraduate course on ethics and information technology.

Conway has extensive research, teaching and administrative experience in the archives and preservation fields and has made major contributions over the past 30 years to the literature on archival users and use, preservation management, and digital imaging technologies. Prior to joining the faculty of the School of Information in 2006, Conway held positions at Duke University (2001-06), Yale University (1992-2001), the Society of American Archivists (1988-89), and the National Archives and Records Administration (1977-87; 1989-92). In 2005, Conway received the American Library Association's Paul Banks and Carolyn Harris Preservation Award for his contributions to the preservation field. He has been a Fellow of the Society of American Archivists since 1997. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan in Library and Information Studies.
